PERFECT PRACTICE TURNING DEMONSTRATION

Practicing woodturning, like any other discipline or craft, should involve a structured and focused approach.

This demonstration consists of several practice projects turned from kiln dried construction grade 2x4. Not only does this illustrate how inexpensive or free wood may be used for practice, but any attempt to scrape the wood will be met with visible tear-out.
